Item #1 New Section 1.04

## Section 1.04 Judges Selection Procedures for Nomination to the FINA Judges' List

This procedure is implemented to provide knowledgeable US judges to the FINA "G" Judges List.

## **Procedure**

- 1. Following the successful completion of international judges training, a list of judges, as prioritized by the Officials Board, shall be provided to the Olympic International Vice President by the Officials Vice President.
- 2. The International Relations Committee will review the judges list and consider the following when prioritizing judges for nomination to the FINA "G" Judges List:
  - a. International Experience (judge, coach, manager, etc) and Observations, if any
  - b. Professionalism
  - c. Ability to judge internationally a minimum of 10 years prior to the mandatory FINA retirement age of 68.
- 3. The International Relations prioritized list of judges will be used to fulfill vacancies in the FINA "G" Judges List.
- 4. FINA judge candidates may contact the Officials Vice President to learn more about improvements they can make in their judging to be considered as a FINA judge in the future.

**Rationale**: To document the process used to name judges to the FINA list.

Item #2 Revision to International Relations Review Subcommittee Responsibilities

Number "Resolve petitions related to:" as 1. and include the following new language as 2.:

2. Investigate any disciplinary actions of members of the National Team Delegation and make any recommendations to a National Board of Review.

**Rationale**: In the current National Team Agreement, under Discipline (Item #16, C & D on page 9), lists the responsibility of investigating any disciplinary actions of members of the National Team Delegation and making any recommendations to a National Board of Review as the responsibility of the IR Review Subcommittee.

**NOTE**: If this revision is approved by the IR Committee, then Law & Legislation will be notified of the change as the responsibilities of the International Relations Review Subcommittee have been submitted to be included in the Code.
